In a Rape Culture, people assume that sexual violence is a fact of life. However, much of what we accept as inevitable is in fact an expression of values and attitudes that can change!

WHAT IS RAPE CULTURE?

Rape culture is a widely used term describing a culture in which rape and sexual violence are common. Prevalent attitudes, norms, practices, and media all condone, normalise, excuse and encourage sexualised violence.

IT CAN INCLUDE:

- Sexist jokes
- Street harassment
- · Victim blaming
- Minimising sexual violence
- Rape supportive lyrics in songs
- Sexual Objectification

AND IS REINFORCED BY:

- Strict gender roles
- Value placed on people because of their gender
- Policy and funding decisions
- Violent sexual media


Listen to and BELIEVE survivors
